


OPERATING BUDGET AND EXPENSES

Our 2021 strategy

There are several ways we have evaluated our programs and things that we want to see in the future:

- Fully open and operate HOPE house to the extent that it is intended.
- Fully Implement all 3 programs (SAFE, Changes & HOPE)
- Increase community impact and education
- Increase Street Outreach to 50 neighbors per month served
- Increase knowledge and effectiveness of our team

PROJECTS	DESCRIPTION
HOPE	Women and children in our H.O.P.E. program are provided support and access to Emergency Transportation, Case Management, Advocacy and Education, legal advocacy, housing assistance, and programming for the youth.
SAFE	S.A.F.E is a case management and stabilization program that provides emergency rental assistance, counseling, peer support, and transportation services to individuals and families.
Changes	Changes help individuals overcome barriers of being a person who possesses a criminal background, or substance abuse disorder in order to obtain stability.

STREET OUTREACH

SAFE-Outreach is a street outreach program that was developed as part of the broader desire to improve stability in individuals and families from disadvantaged communities in the Dallas Metro and San Antonio areas. The program locates, identifies, and builds relationships with individuals experiencing homelessness with the hope of providing immediate support, intervention, and connections with homeless assistance programs, social services, and housing programs. The outreach program has two components - the first deals with referrals from partner organizations and the second is direct engagement involving reaching out to individuals on the street and encampments. The program targets individuals and families living unsheltered. The program includes distribution of emergency supplies such as hygiene products, food, water, PPE gear, clothes, and blankets and case management services.



HOPE HOUSE

House of H.O.P.E. is our new emergency shelter to offer temporary housing for survivors fleeing domestic violence as an added effort to our current domestic violence intervention and prevention services.

Our house of H.O.P.E can provide emergency shelter to a total of 8 survivors. Our 15-day emergency shelter includes comprehensive case management, individual therapy, and support groups. Staff is available 24/7 for additional support if assistance is needed.
